Canadian Red Cross

Individuals, businesses and organizations who have been affected by the flood are strongly encouraged to register with the Red Cross.

This will assist the Township in determining the immediate needs of those affected by the flooding, and will also assist in the recovery efforts.

The Red Cross Reception Centre is located at the S.G. Nesbitt Arena & Community Centre, 55 Parkside Street, daily from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm., until further notice.

Clean-Up Kits

Clean-Up Kits are available at the Red Cross Reception Centre located at the S.G. Nesbitt Arena & Community Centre, 55 Parkside Street, daily from 10:00 am to 7:00 pm., until further notice.

Disposal of Flood Related Waste/Items/Debris

Individuals, businesses and organizations, who have been affected by flood damage, may dispose of this waste at any of the Township Landfills - according to current landfill hours of operation and according to what is currently being accepted at each of these sites.

There is no fee for flood related waste material, however you will be asked to complete a brief form, so that the Township can track the amount of material received. Forms are available at the Township Administration office, located at 7 Milne Street (accessible from St. Germain Street), the Red Cross Reception Centre, and Scotchline Landfill and transfer stations.

Donations

Individuals, businesses and organizations interested in financial or material donations such as non-perishable food, clothing, toiletries, bedding etc. are encouraged to seek out a local community organization of their choice (churches, service clubs etc.), the [Minden Food Bank](#) or [Canadian Red Cross](#).

Emergency Operations Centre (EOC)

The EOC has been activated in accordance with the Township's Emergency plan and Procedures. The control group will continue to work with Trent Severn Waterway and the Ministry of Natural Resources & Forestry and to communicate all information by means of media broadcasting and media releases to radio stations, local newspapers and our website.

Health Unit

Please visit the Health Unit website for information regarding potentially spoiled food, wells, malfunctioning septic systems and boiled water advisory, etc.

Residents with private wells are reminded to contact the **Health Unit** regarding the **safe use and consumption of well water, in the event that the well may be affected by ground water**. If you are concerned about water in or around your residence, or other buildings, call the Hydro Call Centre at 1-888-664-9376. Disconnected services may impact water removal equipment (i.e. sump pumps); therefore, it may also be necessary to contact your insurance company.

Disconnected Hydro Services

Properties that have been disconnected from Hydro must contact the Electrical Safety Authority (ESA) or a qualified electrician in order to have these services reconnected.

Public Washrooms

Due to flooding, the public washrooms located at the Fire hall on Pritchard Street are **CLOSED**, until further notice.

Sandbags

The Township will be collecting sandbags – curbside pickup only. Details regarding this service will be provided at a later date.

The public water tap, located at the Fire Hall, has been reopened. Water services continue to be available at the Water Depot, located at Hwy. 35 and Bobcaygeon Road (adjacent to Jug City). Water is also available at Canadian Tire, accessed from Highway 35 onto Water Street.

To receive important information and updates, including in the event of an emergency, please ensure that you are subscribed to the Minden Hills website, by following these easy instructions:

- Confirm your email address on the next prompt screen.
- Enter in the digits in the captcha box and click the submit button.
- You should receive an email to complete the subscription process, if you don't, check your junk mail.
- Your confirmation email will provide you with a link, select the link.
- The link will allow you to customize your subscription list.
- Select "Emergency Alerts" to receive emergency posts and notifications.
- Select "Newsroom" to receive all other non-emergency posts, including water levels and road closures notifications.
- Select other categories if interested in receiving notifications.
- Select save.

The Township will communicate all information by means of broadcasting media releases to local media, radio stations and the Township website.
