**SUBJECT: Public Notice – Water Advisory for Surrounding Lakes and Rivers**

A Flood Warning/Outlook remains in effect for the Burnt River and Irondale Watershed.

The Gull River system is being monitored and continues to be at normal spring water levels.

The Township of Minden Hills is reminding the public that springtime brings a potential seasonal risk to our area due to rain fall and snow thaw.

Residents in areas that are susceptible to flooding should take necessary precautions to protect property, and continue to monitor developing conditions. Residents are advised that sand and sandbags are available for use at the following locations:

- Roads Department (in the Sand Dome – to the left of the entrance), located at 4564 County Road 121 (Kinmount location).
- Furnace Falls Park - Front Turnaround – County Road 503.

This resource is self-serve, please remember a shovel. Residents are encouraged to think of their neighbours - don't forget about those around you that may have difficulty with this task.

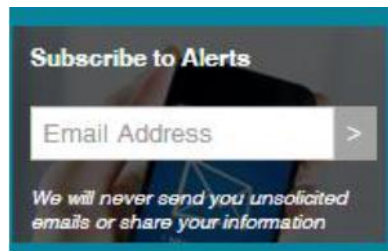
The public is advised to use caution around area lakes, rivers, creeks and other water sources such as ditches, as high water levels and swift currents can create unstable conditions.

Avoid driving on any roadways that are underwater, as road conditions may be unstable and dangerous.

- Select "Newsroom" to receive all other non-emergency posts, including water levels and road closures notifications.
- Select other categories if interested in receiving notifications.
- Select save.
